

## **Seeking Qualified Candidates for the Energy Efficiency Advisory Council**

The **Massachusetts Energy Efficiency Advisory Council** (EEAC) was established in 2008 to oversee the development and implementation of the Massachusetts Three-Year Energy Efficiency Investment Plans, described in G.L. c. 25, § 21. Councilors should expect to attend at least one three-hour EEAC meeting each month, typically held in Boston, with a current option for remote participation. Councilors should also expect to spend several hours reviewing meeting materials prior to each meeting. Lastly, during the current Three-Year Planning process, which started in late summer 2023, Councilors are expected to attend additional meetings as needed.

After this initial screening process, DOER will recommend selected candidates to the Department of Public Utilities for appointment to the EEAC.
